Entry Method

First Received with preference for Miniature Schnauzers. All entries will be accepted on the opening date, but only entries for Miniature Schnauzers will be entered into the trial for the first 2 weeks. All other entries will be put on a waiting list. On February 22 at 8 am, those entries will be entered in the trial in the order received until the trial limits are reached. Entries received after 8 am on February 22 will be entered in the trial in order of receipt regardless of breed until the trial limits are reached.

Online Entries

This trial is accepting online entries through **LabTestedOnline.com**. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows. 132 runs online (40%), 198 runs paper (60%). If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly. **To enter**, go to http://www.labtestedonline.com, create an account, and add your dog's information. From your My Local Events page, you can search for this trial by increasing your mileage or using the State search. Click the "i" icon for the trial and then click Create Entry.

Paper entries received within the first 24 hours must include postage or be metered. Entries must be delivered by multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS, and DHL. You must waive the signature requirement for delivery services, if applicable.

Limit of 10 dogs per envelope. No hand deliveries can be accepted in the first 24 hours.

All entries must be submitted on official AKC Agility entry forms, one dog per entry form. Photocopies of entry forms without the AKC Agreement are not acceptable. Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are not acceptable.

If you would like confirmation that your entry was received before the trial has closed, please include your email address or enclose a self-addressed stamped postcard.

Entries cannot be changed once the trial has closed. Please check your entries!

"After Closing" Waiting List

A waiting list (30 run maximum) will be maintained for this trial once it has closed on March 16. The waiting list will be active until its deadline — Monday, March 28, 6:00 pm CDT. Any runs that are entered in this trial at closing and pulled before the waiting list deadline will be replaced, if possible, by runs in the order on the waiting list, and the exhibitor will be reimbursed in full. If a run is pulled but cannot be replaced, the exhibitor will not receive a refund and the dog will be considered absent for the run. Entry fees for runs on the waiting list that do not get into the trial by the waiting list closing date will be refunded in full.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

Friday's trial is open to all Miniature Schnauzers fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration or Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP). Saturday's and Sunday's trials are open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or are approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds.

Dogs with a PAL/ILP number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind, bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect a dog's physical or mental performance are not eligible to compete. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Rules Applying to Registration and Discipline for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations, it includes both sexes.

AKC Jump Height Cards

All dogs competing in agility must **possess** an official AKC Jump Height Card. An official AKC Jump Height Card is defined as either a permanent jump height card, a valid temporary jump height form, copies of two different measuring forms (placing the dog in the same height class) dated on or after the dog's second birthday, or copies of three different measuring forms (two of which place the dog in the same height class) on or after the dog's second birthday. **You are not required to show your height card or send a copy with your entry. You are required to mark on your entry form if your dog needs to be measured.** For more information please visit http://www.akc.org/events/agility/jump_height_card.cfm

A VMO will be available to measure dogs at these trials.

Move-ups

For the Friday trial: MOVE-UPS close at 6:00 pm CDT, Monday, Mar 28. Move-ups may be sent by regular mail or email to the Trial Secretary. If an email address is provided with your entry, an email confirmation of the move-up will be sent.

For the Saturday and Sunday trials: MOVE-UPS close 30 minutes after the end of the trial on Friday, Apr 1 and Saturday, Apr 2 respectively and must be submitted at the trial.

Change of Entry

As described in Chapter 1, Section 21 of the Regulations for Agility Trials, a dog which is entered in a Novice A class for which it is not eligible may be moved to Novice B. In addition, after the close of entries a dog may be moved down in their class level (ie, Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.

Trial Information

Purina Farms will be open for AMSC-scheduled events starting Wednesday, Mar 30.

The agility crating are will officially be open for setup on Thursday, Mar 31, at 12 pm.

Trial hours are 6:30 am until 30 minutes after the completion of judging.

Ring size: 85' x 110'.

The Event Center is air-conditioned with indoor restrooms. Please bring crates and water for your dogs and clean up supplies.

Limited crating space is available near the agility ring. Protective mats must be under all crates. Please conserve space by double-stacking crates where practical. The Agility Event Committee reserves the right to condense crating space.

Food service is available at the trial site. Only small coolers for treats are allowed; no other outside food is permitted.

Electronic timing will be used at these trials.

Notice to Exhibitors

- The <u>safety of the dogs</u> is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- The American Miniature Schnauzer Club, Inc. may cancel this event in extreme weather conditions.
- Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Event Committee.
- Entry fees will not be refunded if the trial cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Since bitches in season are not allowed to compete in AKC Obedience/Rally/Agility Trials, entry fees less \$5 per class/run entered will be refunded by the club. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification of such a claim for refund by letter or email before the trial commences. Written verification from a veterinarian and a copy of the final Trial Confirmation is required and must be RECEIVED no later than 48 hours after end of the trial.
- Refunds for changes in entries made before closing will be subject to a \$5.00 processing fee. All refunds will be mailed after the specialty.
- No refunds will be given for entries withdrawn after closing in the event a dog and/or handler are injured or absent.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area.
- Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run. The judge need not wait for any dog holding up a class. The American Miniature Schnauzer Club, Inc. has no obligation or responsibility for providing service through a public address system or steward for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought to the ring when required.
- Entries must be made on Official AKC entry forms or copies and <u>must include the signed</u>
 <u>Agreement and Rules</u>. <u>Junior Handlers</u> must enter their JH# and complete back of form.
 Include only AKC titles on entries.
- Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, regardless of whoever may have made such errors. No entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Errors in entries made by the exhibitor cannot be corrected after the closing date. No refunds for duplicate entries.
- Dogs under 4 months of age are not permitted on the show grounds of AKC Agility Trials.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites and any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There is a \$25 returned check fee.
- No refunds will be issued for overpayment of less than \$10.
- Checks for canceled entries will be shredded. No checks will be returned.
- Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.
- The American Miniature Schnauzer Club, Inc., its Boards and Members, and Nestlé Purina Farms and its employees will not be liable for any loss or injury which may be sustained through disappearance, loss, theft, communicable disease, parasites, injury and/or death of dogs entered in this event.
- Purina Event Center is open from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm.
- All buildings are NON-SMOKING. Smoking is permitted outside in designated areas.
- No spectators or dogs are allowed on the second floor of the Purina Event Center.



AMSC supports the **Live to Run Again** program. This program is designed to use audio books to assist the driver to remain awake during travel to and from agility trials.

The Live to Run Again Campaign was founded and launched by Tail Blazers Agility Club in memory of Jane Callaghy, one of its founding members. The Campaign is now a non-profit organization in Pennsylvania dedicated to national public education about drowsy driving.

On the afternoon of April 1, 2001, while returning from a competition, an admired agility competitor and dog enthusiast died in a tragic auto accident when the driver of her vehicle fell asleep at the wheel. Out of this terrible, and preventable, tragedy emerged the LRA Campaign, which is a volunteer-driven organization committed to raising awareness of the importance of driving alert and rested.

If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

2016 MiniPalooza AMSC Agility Invitational Showcase Weave Pole Relay Game

The first Miniature Schnauzer Agility Invitational Showcase offers the opportunity to recognize the country's top Miniature Schnauzer agility performance dogs. Eligibility for this event is determined by the 2015 AKC Top 25 Miniature Schnauzer Agility Invitational list. The Agility Invitational Showcase event will be held as a companion event to the American Miniature Schnauzer Club Top 20 Breed competition which is scheduled to be held during the evening of Friday, April 1, 2016. This is an approved non-regular AKC class.

The philosophy of this event is to recognize the top agility performance dogs in a creative and fun way that will be both rewarding for the dog teams and the audience. Each of the invitees will be asked to participate in a weave pole relay team game.

There will be two identical courses set up in a straight run consisting of a start jump, a set of weave poles, a second jump and a "U" shaped tunnel. After completing the first pass over the 4 obstacles, dogs will exit out of the tunnel and return back over the jump, through the weave poles and ending on the jump. The next dog can leave when the first dog completes the last jump and is in the control of the handler. The first team to finish the course wins. Knocked bars are not penalized, but if weave poles are missed, the team needs to fix it or forfeit the run. Jumps will be set to a lower common height (8"). Music will be played during the relay to add excitement.

The announcer will divide the crowd into 2 groups and aim to get a cheering contest going. It is a best 2 out of 3 to "win" the relay event. We anticipate this relay race will be fun for both handlers and dogs.

Each agility showcase participant will receive a rosette; no entry fee will be collected for invitees to participate.


